ATTENTION GRCC enrollees:

FAST TRACK - Students are saving up to \$1200 in tuition and books through Fast Track. This program is a free three-week intensive learning lab guided by a professional tutor, designed to help students bypass one of the following required courses: EN 097, RD 097/098 or MA 095/097/098.

This program offers students a unique opportunity to brush-up on their reading, writing, or math skills before retaking the Accuplacer test, while also receiving personalized support from a Success Coach. Over 70% of students who participate in FastTrack bypass their original Developmental Education class placement and place into college-level class
