- Welcome to Peach Plains a special welcome back to Principal Jason Lawson as he recently returned to GHAPS after being away for a couple of years and thank you for hosting this month's meeting.
- Congratulations to Rita McLary and the students for their incredible performance of Mary Poppins.
- Congratulations to Juli Dick, Melissa Meyers and Iain Novoselich for the outstanding performances this
 holiday season, especially the Holiday Spectacular where band, choir and orchestra all came together for
 one performance. There are still a few opportunities next week for additional performing arts
 performances by our lower grades.
- Welcome to Sue Bays, Executive Director of the Grand Haven Schools Foundation (GHSF). The mission of GHSF is to support the quality education of students through funding various grant initiatives. Last Friday, GHSF had a surprise grant celebration rewarding staff with over \$52,000 in grants. They have a number of grant initiatives including Teacher Mini Grants, Field Trip Grants awards which is a program for Title I schools, New teacher Classroom Library where every new K-6 teacher is given \$500 to build their classroom library and District Impact grants that help support larger initiatives throughout the district. A special thank you to the American Legion Auxiliary for their support of the New Teacher Classroom Library grant by donating a book that was distributed to new teachers. GHSF also provides full tuition preschool scholarships and currently supports 34 preschool students. Last year, GHSF gave over \$99,000 in grant awards and they are hoping to exceed that amount this year. Donor support is how they can do what they do each year. Visit ghsf.org for more information.

Public Comment:

Kate Hoffmeyer - spoke regarding curriculum changes, specifically Algebra. She questioned why curriculum votes by the board of education are typically unanimous and why board members are not asking more questions related to curriculum changes. In regards to the Iready manipulatives, her understanding is that it is an Al run, 30 minute requirement for english and math. Her children turn on the manipulative and just let it run. Kate states that according to an email from a teacher, many students are doing that as well and she wonders why we are paying for an Al tutor when kids are just letting it run and not engaging with it.

Mary Jane Evink introduced Peach Plains Principal Jason Lawson. Jason and his team, which included Instructional Coach Jen Kenney, 1st grade Teacher Danielle Bolthouse and Kindergarten Teacher Mariah Mulcahy, provided an update on Peach Plain's efforts to improve learning and school ready behavior. They shared how they use data and shared learning to progress toward the building-wide math goal, how the math resources from our Solution Tree Consultant are being utilized, and how creating school families and Responsive Classrooms provide clarity and connection for a productive learning environment.
