#### Summary of Issue:

The Michigan School Code requires local school boards to review and approve the budget of their intermediate school district (Ottawa Area ISD) before the ISD Board can approve it.

### **Budget Highlights:**

- Projecting a deficit of over \$900,000 for FY2026
- Capital Project Building Controls (\$23,900)...
  - Upgrades are being planned to the district wide building controls for both energy efficiency, and building safety and security.
- Capital Project Filter First (\$8,798)...
  - Plans to install filtered faucets district wide to ensure highest quality drinking water. This is a continuation of the work previously grant funded.
- Capital Project- Central Office/Conference Center/Early Childhood Center (\$1,650,000)...
  - Construction project to renovate the current M-TEC building. This is the last phase of the bond construction project to create additional space for CTC programs. The operating funds of the district will support the expenditures not covered by the bond proceeds.

#### Other Significant Items to Note:

In 2023/24, the General Fund budget had a surplus of \$89,770. The projected budget for the 2024/25 year has a surplus of \$1,098,956. This surplus is related to the timing of a capital project. The FY26 budget reflects an operating deficit, attributable primarily to one time expenditures mostly in the capital needs of the district.
