

SENIOR TIMELINE

September:

-Consider your options for after high school: Work, Apprenticeship, Certification, Military, Community College, and College/University. Note –in most cases, you can begin at any level and progress to a college degree. This site can help you explore career and education options: <u>https://www.mynextmove.org/</u>

-Create a Parchment Account to send your high school transcript to colleges. You can find instructions in your high school guidance office. <u>https://www.parchment.com/</u> (Tip: to save time – answer "no" to the question about helping you find colleges and scholarships – if you say yes – it requires much more time, and you may get emails you don't want).

October- November:

Note: All Seniors will participate in "Do You Have a Plan?" week at your high school.

College:

-Complete and submit applications for college/community College. **Most colleges in Michigan waive the application fee in October.**

----If you are potentially going to be a college athlete, be sure to register with the NCAA Eligibility Center at www.ncaa.org

December - March

APPLY- FINANCIAL AID

There is **no deadline for the FAFSA**, you are advised to complete the FAFSA before March if possible. The FAFSA is available on December 1st. IMPORTANT : BE SURE TO WAIT UNTIL AFTER DECEMBER 1ST AND CHOOSE THE CORRECT FAFSA APPLICATION (25-26). <u>https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa</u>

_Check your high school counseling web page or office for local scholarships.

_Be apply for college-based scholarships. Each college has information about scholarships on their website.

_Check FASTWEB.com for your eligibility for other scholarships, Fastweb is free and has a database of thousands of scholarships. <u>www.fastweb.com</u>

February - March
