Grade Level: 10th through 12th

Credits : 1/2 Credit

Prerequisite Courses : Students must have passed Intro to Studio/Intro to Digital and Drawing 1.

Class Fee

There is a class fee of \$10 for this course. Payment by check or cash is preferred; credit cards are accepted as well.

Course Description

Drawing 1 is for students who are interested in creating art through drawing based mediums. Students will be taught basic drawing techniques from imagination and observation. Students will use a variety of tools and materials to create drawings that are original art with an emphasis on composition and craft. Students will keep weekly sketches and study various works of art history.

Course Objectives

- To foster creative thought and expression through drawing
- To use the elements of art and the principles of design in an original drawing
- To become familiar with and use vocabulary specific to drawing
- To understand and appreciate the value of drawing
- To become familiar with, as well as, to appreciate the historical aspects of drawing
- To understand and appreciate the value of critique
- To heighten perceptual awareness
- To create drawings with a degree of craftsmanship and composition
- To gain mastery in various drawing materials, tools and techniques
- To display and photograph work professionally

Student Expectations

1. **CLASS TIME:** Students are responsible for using class time for on-task assigned activities only and for the proper use and cleaning up of their work areas, tools and equipment.
2. **ASSIGNMENT COMPLETION:** Students are responsible for the completion of all assignments prior to assessment.
3. **ASSESSMENTS (TESTS, QUIZZES, FINAL EXAM):** Students are responsible for preparing for tests/quizzes (via in-class instruction and construction experiences, note taking and outside of class studying).

All pieces of portfolio work will require a self-evaluation and must be turned in on time. Incomplete, unsigned work will not be accepted. Late work is accepted one week after the due date without a grade penalty. After the first week an assignment loses 20% per day. Late work will receive a lower grade unless prior arrangements are made with the instructor.

Every student is expected to participate daily in class. This includes studio work, critiques and class discussion/note taking. Students are expected to follow the rules of the studio, including etiquette and clean up. Participation, on-task use of class time and project progression will be assessed with studio grades. Students are responsible for the proper use/care of assigned supplies/equipment.

Grading Policy

CLASS WORK

STUDIO WORK: (20%) Studio work will include:

1. Pre/Post tests/quizzes, Mid term and Final Exam
2. Presentation notes
3. Notebook and design exercises: Preliminary drawings/painting exercises
4. Critiques
5. Daily progress
6. Clean up and studio etiquette

PORTFOLIO: (80%) A portfolio is the collection of art products created during class.

These

will be evaluated based on creativity, technique, craftsmanship and level of mastery. Self-evaluations must be turned in on time with the piece in order to receive a grade. You should be working on your photos and summary of work in your digital portfolio after each assignment is completed.

1. **Creativity:** Your ideas, process and originality
2. **Planning and Vocabulary/Art History:** Portfolio work will require pre-planning and notes to be turned in by their due dates.
3. **Level of Mastery:** Did you understand and follow directions?
4. **Technique/Craftsmanship:** How well is the work done?
5. **Portfolio Documentation:** A digital compilation of the semester's work will be turned in along with an artist statement photos and a summary for each piece.
6. **Critique:** Students will be required to participate in class discussions and peer review of one another's work.

FINAL EXAM:

A final exam will be given that will include a written test and the average of the portfolio grades throughout the semester.

SEMESTER GRADE: The semester grade will be an average of the term grade (80%), and the final exam (20%).

Scope and Sequence

1. New Classics

- i. Reimagining a famous work of art to make it personally relevant/meaningful.
- ii. 9"x12" paper, medium of choice

2. Storybook Illustration

- i. Writing and illustrating a story for a picture book.
- ii. Two 10"x10" drawings and one 10"x20" drawing, alcohol markers on paper.

3. Portraiture

- i. Drawing an expressive self-portrait in a representational style.
- ii. 11"x14" illustration board, oil pastel.

4. Architectural Design

- i. Redesigning Grand Haven High School using design thinking strategies.
- ii. 12"x16" paper, India Ink and watercolor dye.

5. Character Design

- i. Applying figure drawing skills to concept art.
- ii. 12"x18" paper, color pencil
