Course Description

Two semesters, Advanced level of difficulty Open to: Juniors, Seniors. Choral Ensemble is a highly select mixed choir (Soprano, Alto, Tenor, Bass) of sixteen to twenty singers. Students learn advanced singing & performance techniques, to read music at an advanced level, historical music styles and techniques, music theory, cooperation skills, problem solving skills and goal setting to achieve standards of excellence. After school and evening performances may be extensive. Concert/Performances include: Inauguration, CCR, Fall, Winter, District/State Solo & Ensemble Festival, Spring, Youth Arts Festival and 15-25 community performances a year. Admittance is by audition which will be held in the Spring.

Course Objectives

Learn: healthy vocal technique, reading music notation, performing, variety of musical styles, group learning skills, team work, problem solving, creative thinking skills and expression through music.

Student Expectations

All choir students are expected to bring a great attitude and work ethic to each class, rehearsal or performance. Members of the choir are also required to be at all concerts, scheduled choir events and extra rehearsals. Choir is a team effort and participation of each person is vital for the success of all. The choir calendar is passed out on the first week of school. Students and parents are expected to schedule around concerts, scheduled choir events and any extra rehearsals.
