## **Prologue**

The purpose of Drama 1 is to give the student exposure to and experience with a variety of theatre disciplines at a basic level. At the end of this course, each participant will be able to:

- Identify and use basic theatre terms
- Create and perform a short pantomime
- Practice vocal exercises
- Analyze a character from a play
- Understand basic technical theatre concepts
- Perform a short monologue or scene

Synopsis: This class is a PARTICIPATION class. It is difficult to make up the activities in class. Participation, or lack of, will affect grades. Points will be given each week for attendance and loss of point will occur for tardies and absences. An unexcused absence will result in loss of all attendance points for the week. An unexcused absence on performance day will result in a zero grade for the performance. Multiple excused absences can also result in a loss of attendance points. In other words, you need to be here!

## Act I

<u>Standards Taught</u>: This class utilizes both the Michigan High School Content Standards in English/Performing Arts and National Standards for Theatre Arts.

Textbook & Materials: Theatre Preparation and Performance (plus a good attitude in class).

Electronic devices: These are not allowed during class unless specified by the teacher.

<u>Rule(s)</u>: #1 is <u>RESPECT</u> – for teacher, student, classmates, and materials.

Every day the class will warm up physically and vocally, taking turns leading the exercises. Students should know the warm ups well enough to do them without the teacher's lead. Each student will also be expected to give these full attention and participation.

**Please note**: Students will summarize and critique one performance out of class. It will not be up to me to schedule this or provide tickets; students should take this responsibility on their own. The show can be a GHHS production, one produced in our community, or a show that is touring. The format of the critique will be provided in class.
