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Deutsch 1 - Semester 1 - Syllabus

Learning a language can be rewarding in a great number of ways. I often hear from former students about how they were able to use their German skills, in the military, at work, while traveling, to connect with family, while studying abroad or sometimes just for their own personal growth. Curriculum by unit themes:

Wer bist du? (Who are you?) In this unit, students will learn how to introduce themselves. Introductions will include greetings and basic personal information like name, age, where your from and how you get to school. Students will also learn how to close a conversation with a good-bye.

Spiel und Spaß (free time, fun and interests) In this unit, students will dive into the world of verbs to discuss what they like to do in their free time.

Komm mit nach Hause! (family and life at home) In this unit, students will learn how to describe relationships and talk about appearance.

Alles für die Schule! (everything related to school) In this unit, students will learn how to talk about their school day including schedules and required materials.

Pacing:

I'll teach and you'll learn four units this semester. At the end of each unit you'll be assessed over all of the content for that unit. Expect smaller assessments along the way so I can keep my eyes on learning and come back around to anything we've missed before the end of the unit. Language learning takes practice in *reading*, *writing*, *listening* and *speaking*. You will practice all of those on the days we are together when possible.

Assessments will include all of those areas, too. We'll have 8 to 9 class periods, 90 minutes each, to complete each unit.
