Course Description

This special education course focuses on the areas of reading, writing, and speaking. Students will learn various strategies to enhance their skills in each of these areas. This course is only for students with an IEP on a PC.

Course Objectives

Students will learn strategies to improve reading comprehension and written expression. Students will also learn and use the writing process.

Student Expectations

A positive attitude will bring positive results, and all students and staff are expected to do their personal best in class daily. Respect for yourself, others, and the environment around you will also be expected from everyone in the classroom. If student's behavior is disrespectful or disruptive, discipline actions will follow.

All daily assignments are due the following day. Late work will be accepted but will only receive partial credit. All assignments must be turned in at least 3 days prior to the start of our final writing project.

Quizzes, Tests, Major Written Assignments and Writer's Notebook- 60% In-Class Work and Homework - 40%

Scope and Sequence

A variety of texts will be used to teach reading, writing and speaking strategies including at least one novel or informational text, and student choice selections. Students will complete at least one essay per semester to reflect understanding of the presented text. The final exam will be a final written project.
