Course Description

This course is designed for students enrolled in the MERIT program. This class will be combined with a general education government class, with the MERIT students being on separate roster and a special education teacher collaborating with the general education teacher. The goal of this American Government course is active engagement in public discourse as citizens in our democracy. The role of service in the community and the rights and responsibilities of citizenship are emphasized.

Course Objectives

This class encourages active discussion about politics, students in this course may conduct a trial, participate in an election, debate in a legislature, and complete other hands-on assignments.
