Grade Levels: 9-10

Credits: 1.0 (.5 per semester)

Course Description

Reading and Writing Workshop 1 and 2 are courses designed to support students as they build the necessary literacy skills to be successful in all content area classes. Through novels, short stories, informational texts, and word study, students strengthen foundational literacy skills, fluency, vocabulary knowledge, and comprehension strategies. Instruction is targeted to meet the needs of students and support their success in a variety of classes requiring reading and writing. Students also learn organizational skills as they keep a current planner and track grades on a weekly basis.

Course Objectives

Students will

- develop foundational reading skills including fluency, vocabulary knowledge, and strategies for identifying unknown words.
- increase reading comprehension through the use of strategies including note taking, annotating, discussing, making connections, journaling, visualizing, and predicting.
- learn how to craft well organized paragraphs and essays.
- increase executive functioning skills like planning, organizing, and preparing for tests.

Student Expectations

Students should expect to read and write daily. They should expect to follow the social contract established as a group and uphold the ideas behind TEAM GH.

The exam will consist of reading a short story or article, demonstrating understanding of the text through annotations, short answer questions, and longer written responses. The exam also includes a reflection on how the student feels they have developed and grown as a reader and writer throughout the course.
