### Course Description

It is through the reading and analysis of literature that we develop these close reading and critical thinking skills. It is through the process of writing that we learn to put our thoughts into words that are both powerful and easy to understand. Therefore the focus of this course is writing and the close reading of literature.

### Course Objectives

- Learn & identify literary terminology (through short stories & novels)
- Read closely & analytically (through fiction & nonfiction)
- Read frequently & independently
- Be culturally literate (*Fahrenheit 451*, *Romeo and Juliet*, *The Odyssey*)
- Write clearly & coherently (through multiple types of mechanically sound writing)
- Communicate thoughts & ideas clearly (class discussion & presentations)
- Think critically & independently
- Strengthen IEP Goal Areas
- Become familiar with standardized test questions and learn strategies to feel more comfortable taking tests such as the ACT and SAT, with or without accommodations
