Course Description

ALC-A is a eighteen-week course students need to fulfill one of their English graduation requirements. It is a course that focuses on the study of various pieces of American literature, which provide the backdrop for student writing. The course is divided into two units that are nine weeks in length, and are based on two themes of study.

Grading Policy

Participation - 20%:

In addition to the obvious (being prepared for class, staying alert and focused, and participating in discussions and small group activities), the participation portion of your grade will include a weekly participation grade and your completion of daily written responses.

Vocabulary and Grammar - 30%:

We will complete vocabulary assignments based on words used in the novels and text. In addition to the vocabulary packet and quiz, you will complete various smaller assignments designed to help you learn the words' spelling, definitions, and usage. We will also review grammar and mechanics concepts periodically throughout the year.

Assignments and Assessments - 50% (Final Exam composes 20%): Assignments for this class include both informal and formal writing, individual and group projects and discussion questions, occasional reading quizzes, and graphic organizers, as well as a variety of other means of enhancing your learning.
