The vocal music classes at Lakeshore are meant to foster a joy of singing and love of all music. Students will continue to gain confidence through an open and affirming rehearsal environment. A positive attitude and willingness to experience new things are key components to the success of the choir! <u>**7**</u>th<u>**Grade Concert Choir:**</u> This choir is open to all seventh graders at Lakeshore Middle School and meets during the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} hours of the day. The choirs are separated by voice type (treble and developing tenor and bass).

<u>8th Grade Chorale:</u> This choir is open to all eighth graders at Lakeshore Middle School and meets during the 1st and 4th hours of the day. The choirs are separated by voice type (treble and developing tenor and bass).

Purpose/Course Description

In all choirs, students will learn a variety of choral music and be given the opportunity to showcase their singing development through performance. Music history, theory, listening, and appreciation, as well as vocal pedagogy and music reading skills are taught in a safe, fun, and creative learning environment.

Topics, Concepts, or Units of Study

At the end of the year, students will be able to:

- Demonstrate knowledge, understanding, and application of basic choral music.
- Produce a grade appropriate choral sound.
- Demonstrate proper concert etiquette.
- Demonstrate an intermediate knowledge of music theory.
- Demonstrate an intermediate knowledge of solfege.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the text of the music.
- Listen critically to a piece of music and generate topics of discussion
- Have experience with movement as it relates to music.
- Experience several genres of music through choral music singing and other venues

Class Room Expectations:

- 1. Be **Respectful** of others and yourself.
 - a. Respect your classmates, teachers, and guests and you shall receive respect in return.

2. Be on time and prepared

- a. Students should be in their designated seats with their <u>music and pencil</u> ready to work when class begins
- 3. Try, Try, and Try Again
 - a. Singing is hard work, Attitude and effort determine the success of the choir. Strive for the best and have fun!
- 4. Absolutely NO food, gum, or beverages in the classroom
 - a. A bottle of water is allowed and encouraged.

<u>Student responsibilities and expectations:</u> Students are expected to behave in a mature and respectful manner and adhere to the school code of conduct and the social contract. An open and positive attitude is essential.

<u>Consequences</u>: Consequences for inappropriate behavior include (but are not limited to) student conference, parental contact, referral to the appropriate administrator, in-house suspension, and even out-of-school suspension for severe examples of such behavior.

<u>Passes</u>: Students must get permission for the teacher in order to leave the classroom. Upon leaving the classroom, the student must have a designated pass.

<u>Cheating</u>: The act of obtaining answers or completing assignments in a fraudulent or deceitful manner. Staff and administrators will determine disciplinary action based on the outline in the student handbook.

Concert and Festival Uniforms

The 7th and 8th grade choirs are provided with a formal choir uniform that was purchased through the school district. **Each student is responsible for having black dress shoes and black socks. Each 7th and 8th grader is expected to pay a \$10.00 dry cleaning fee. If the dry cleaning fee presents a financial burden, please let Mr. Payton or Mr. Rodgers know and the fee will be waived. The dry cleaning fee is expected to be turned in by Friday, September 7th**. Hair must be worn off the face and jewelry is not allowed. Uniform return will be at the end of the year. Lost/Damaged uniforms will result in a replacement fee for the cost of the uniform.

Folders:

A rehearsal folder will be provided to each singer. If a folder is returned damaged, there will be a \$25 fee to replace the folder.

Dressing appropriately for concert performances not only *looks* professional, but also makes a student feel they are really part of the entire group. Please make sure that your student is dressed appropriately for all concert performances.



Grading System:

Student grades will be based on class participation and attitude (rehearsal technique), written assignments and tests, listening skills, and participation in required performances. The breakdown of grading will be as follows:

Participation: 40% Class Work: 30% Performance: 30%

Participation:

Students may receive 3 participation points for every class period. As a member of the Lakeshore Choir Program, students are expected to receive all three points every day. These points are based on a student's energy and concentration during rehearsal, respect towards classmates and the teacher, posture, marking music with their pencil, arriving to class on time, and participating in class discussions. If a student loses his/her folder or does not have a pencil, they will lose one participation point for the day.

Class Work:

This includes tests, quizzes, assignments, and projects. For any missed assignment or test due to an excused absence, it is the responsibility of the student to make arrangements with the teacher to make up the work. Late work will result in a lowering of the grade for each day late.

Performances:

Concerts are REQUIRED for every choir student. Students must arrive at the designated time, be dressed in the appropriate uniform, display appropriate concert behavior and stay for the entire concert in order to receive full credit

Performance Absences:

The teacher must approve all absences from performances. Illness, team sport games, and family trips are examples of excused absences. All 'prior commitments' must be cleared by the teacher at the start of the school year. Transportation issues, homework, and sports or club practice **will not be considered an excused absence.** If an unavoidable conflict occurs, please see, write, or call the teacher as soon as possible. With enough advanced notice, sometimes the negative effects on the ensemble can be minimized. **Except in the case of an emergency, a note from home or phone call at least two weeks prior to the performance is required for an excused absence.**

Extra Credit:

Extra credit projects are always accepted as a way to bring up a **participation**, **performance** or **class work** grade. All make-up work must be approved by the teacher first and turned in before the end of the marking period. Projects include turning in programs from outside fine arts experiences (held during that marking period), reports on musical or choral topics, etc. The sky's the limit!

All School Musical

Buccaneer Union is an all-male vocal ensemble consisting of singers from 7th-12th grade. Rehearsals are held on Mondays from 3pm-4:30pm at GHHS throughout the year. 7th and 8th grade students are bussed to GHHS after school. Buccaneer Union performs on most HS and MS Choir Concerts.

Lakeshore Honors Choir

Lakeshore Honors Choir is an auditioned extra-curricular choir comprised of 7th and 8th students who are dedicated and focused singers. Honors Choir rehearses 3pm-5pm most Wednesdays at Lakeshore beginning Wednesday, September 12th. Students will sing advanced choral repertoire and develop a healthy and age-appropriate choral sound. You do not have to be in curricular choir at Lakeshore to audition.
