An optional insurance policy is available for \$20 (\$15 for reduced meal students and \$5 for free meal students) which covers the first two ACCIDENTAL device damages for the year (no deductible). For those students unable to attend Student Orientation, retake pictures will be taken on September 26, 2024. **☐ FOOD SERVICES** Online Breakfast and lunch are served at Lakeshore Middle School. You may contribute to your student's account online at www.grandhaven.familyportal.cloud or make a check payable to GHAPS and send it with your student to school. Families that may qualify need to fill out the Free/Reduced Lunch Application. You may complete the Free/Reduced Lunch Application online at www.lunchapp.com or stop by Student Services. Information and forms about reduced or free meals are available online at www.ghaps.org. ☐ ATHLETICS Online Students will need a current sports physical before participating in any sports. Physicals done after 4/15/2024 are valid for the 2024-2025 school year. The costs are as follows for sports: Participation fee is \$60/athlete per sport with a family maximum of \$400 per school year. Insurance fee is \$30/sport. There is a \$100 deductible, which may be satisfied by other valid collectible insurance or plan payments, which will be applied to each claim. □ BUS DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP Students will be dropped off and picked up in front of the building on Cutler between Park and Colfax. Staff will be available after school each day to help students find their bus. Buses drop off and pick up in the same spots all year.
□ PARENT DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP Parents who drop off students before or after school <u>must</u> , for safety reasons, use the northwest parking lot located across from the school on Cutler Street. The south loop is reserved for special education buses, staff, and office visitors.
□ DRESS CODE
As a reminder, the full GHAPS 5-12 school dress code policy is listed in our handbook on our website. Listed below are a few of the common dress code concerns:
