Why have playground rules?

- We have playground rules for two reasons:
 - To keep students **safe** and free from injury.
 - To ensure **all** students are able to use our playground in a way that is **comfortable** for all.

We expect everyone
at our school to follow them.

Obeying Adults During Recess

- The adults on duty are there for important reasons.
- They keep us safe.
- We must treat them with **respect** and **follow directions**.

Where Do I Play?



- To be safe, we must stay in the boundaries.
- To stay in Peach Plains **boundaries**, we:
 - Stay inside fences
 - Stay on the grass/cement
 - Out of woods
 - Out of parking lots

Kindergarteners

- We stay on west "LITTLE KIDS" playground.
- We play only on the woodchips.
- There are:
 - Swings
 - Bars
 - Slides
 - and climbing rockwalls

First Graders

- We play on the west "little kids" playground.
- The areas we can go include the:
 - wood chips
 - blacktop behind the school
- We stay inside of the fences so we're safe.
- When we're in second grade, we can use the grass.

Second Graders

- During the morning and afternoon recesses, we play on the:
 - Wood chips
 - Blacktop
 - Fenced in areas
- During our noon lunch recess, we play on the:
 - Blacktop
 - Middle playground
 - Grassy area
 - Swings up to monkey bars

Third-Fifth Graders

- We play on the East "big kids" playground.
- The areas we can go include the:
 - New Grassy area
 - spider, swings and monkey bars
 - Climbing wall and slides
 - Tire swing and bars
 - Baseball diamond and basketball court

Big Kid Boundaries

- We stay **inside** of the fences and **out of the woods** so we're safe.
- We use the field, but stay close enough to hear an adult.
- We play on the sidewalk, but away from the bike path and front of school.



Safety on Slides



- Slide **down**
- Face forward
- On **bottoms**
- Keep personal space
- Keep hands to ourselves
- Take turns

Safety on Swings

- Only sit and go **forward**/back
- Swing without underdogs
- Use our arms to push a friend
- Swings stay down, and aren't thrown over the top
- Two on the tire swing



Safety on the Bars

- Sit on the bars
- Keep **personal space**
- Keep hands and feet to self
- Only **three** people on a bar

More Safety...

- Football, basketball and soccer are fun
- **Save tackle games** for the neighborhood
- Play king of the mountain at home
- Take **turns** on the climbing wall
- Don't jump or push on the top of equipment
- Cones = stay away so you are safe
 - Wet or slippery

Being Bike Responsible

- When you are in **third grade or older**, you can ride your bike to school.
- We park and lock our bikes in the rack.
- We wear helmets.



Riding Bikes

- Peach Plains Panthers save bike riding for the **bike path**.
- We walk our bikes when we get to school, especially on the sidewalk.
- Bikes stay off of the grass, so our grass stays healthy and green! 😊
